A fully packed programme

Each day of the conference will include practical and thought-provoking sessions covering both endocrine and diabetes topics, underpinned by robust science and key national and international trials.

We were delighted to receive c.125 really high quality abstract submissions for this year's conference. As a result, the programme will feature 88 posters, which will all be included in a poster tour over the course of the event. There will also be 36 Oral Communications on topics in the following categories and others: Bone; Pituitary and Growth; Gonadal, DSD and reproduction; Adrenal and Obesity and Diabetes.


Entries for this award are welcome from all paediatric endocrine nurse members involved in the care of children with endocrine disorders.

Trainee Update

RCPCH Progress Curriculum Problem with Tagging Transfer

As some of you may have discovered, there has been a problem with the transfer of tagging from the 2010 Generic Curriculum to the Progress curriculum in the ePortfolio during the move to the new curriculum. The College has produced a document of apology and advised these need to retagged manually. All other tags should not be affected. You do not however need to retag anything in your previously completed Levels. It is hoped that your subspecialty tags are unaffected. Migration of tags is expected to be completed by the end of September 2018. Please note that Grid and SPIN trainees will continue to use the Diabetes SPIN checklist as evidence of achieving their diabetes competencies

News from the Clinical Committee

Surveys

New Patient Information Leaflets

New leaflets on <u>Pubertal Gynaecomastia</u> and <u>Diabetes Insipidus</u> have been added to the BSPED website within the Patient Information section.

Further leaflets will be added as they are created and reviewed.

Further updates from the Clinical Committee

The Paediatric Endocrine Standards are currently being finalised by a BSPED Working Party for wider review.

The Clinical Committee is reviewing the Rare Endocrine Tumour guidelines as they are released for consultation.

The Clinical Committee intends to start the next cycle of Peer Review towards the end of the year.

The Committee is continuing to work on a Delphi questionnaire to audit standard protocols for Glucagon Stimulation tests, Insulin Intolerance Tests (ITT) and the use of sex hormone priming for growth hormone testing amongst tertiary centres. This will be circulated to members shortly.

Multiple Endocrine Neoplasia Type 1 (MEN1) guideline – stakeholder consultation

The stakeholder consultation for the 5 year endeavour to produce interdisciplinary, NICE-standardised, management guidelines on 8 Paediatric Endocrine Tumours, is taking place over the next few months.

The guidelines will be endorsed by the RCPCH who oversaw methodology, hosted from the CCLG who assisted development, and adopted by the BSPED at whose request they were updated. Formal peer reviewed publications will follow.

You are currently invited to comment on the draft clinical guideline, *Multiple Endocrine Neoplasia Type 1 (MEN1)*.

Please review the **consultation document** and record any comments on the **comments proforma**.

Please return this form to the RCPCH Clinical Standards Team by 12pm, Monday 8 October 2018.

The 8 topics covered by the guidelines are below:

- 1. Craniopharyngioma
- 2. Pituitary Adenoma
- 3. Idiopathic Thickening of Pituitary Stalk and /or Idiopathic Central Diabetes Insipidus
- 4. Differentiated Thyroid Cancer
- 5. Pheochromocytoma and Paraganglioma
- 6. Adrenocortical Tumours
- 7. Multiple Endocrine Neoplasia Type 1
- 8. Medullary Thyroid Cancer and Multiple Endocrine Neoplasia type 2

Next steps for genomic medicine in the NHS - regulation, challenges for adoption and priorities for research

20th November 2018 – Central London

This seminar will bring together key stakeholders to discuss the next steps for personalised medicine and genomics.

Delegates will consider the main issues for the new NHS Genomic Medicine Service as it becomes fully operational in October - as well as the results of the <u>100,000 Genomes Project</u>, with the Project aiming to have completed sequencing by the end of the year.

Planned sessions will look at the work of the NHS Genomic Medicine Centres as they aim to deliver the pledge of 90,000 samples of DNA from patients and family members with rare disease and cancer by September 2018 - as well as the findings from the Common's Science and Technology Committee report Genomics and genome editing in the NHS.

Further sessions focus on next steps for education and training, following the continuation of the <u>Genomics</u> <u>Education Programme</u> and priorities for patients - looking at key issues for patients' data and ensuring public trust.
