Call for nominations for Chair and Secretary of the BSPED

Applications are requested for the positions of Chair and Secretary of the BSPED. These vacancies will arise due to the completion of the extended terms of office of Dr Justin Davies and Professor Jo Blair. Successful candidates will join the Executive Committee as Chair-elect and Secretary-elect (non-voting) following the AGM on Thursday 28 November 2019. They will then complete a 3-year term as Chair and Secretary starting from November 2020.



The successful candidates will be elected via an e-vote by members, not a ballot at the AGM.

In these roles you will attend quarterly Executive Committee meetings (three via teleconference and one face to face on the eve of the BSPED Annual Meeting), where you will make strategic and operational decisions regarding the running of the Society and ensure the content of the AGM accurately reflects the BSPED position and activities. You will also be in regular contact via email to ensure timely decisions are made, supported by the BSPED Office. You will be the figureheads, trustees and directors of the Society, and the main points of contact for other relevant bodies.



News from the Clinical Committee

DKA Calculator

Please be advised that the DKA Calculator is currently unavailable while some essential maintenance is carried out to ensure it remains accurate when used with modern browsers.

Hydrocortisone audit

Following a recent MHRA directive, the BSPED is surveying its members on the use of muco-adhesive buccal hydrocortisone in the treatment of Adrenal Insufficiency. The survey takes only a minute to complete. We would be grateful if you could [complete this survey](#) as soon as possible.

SNOMED

NHS England has been aiming to go paperless by 2020. Clinical coding will play a part in this and is intended to be more upfront and available to care givers. SNOMED is a database of clinical codes, managed by the RCPCH, designed to include more than just diagnostic information. The Clinical Committee is collating a list of paediatric endocrinology terms to be included in the database.

Growth Hormone Audit

We'd like to remind you about the BSPED National Growth Hormone (GH) Audit, and encourage you to submit your data on newly-prescribed GH in children < 16 years old. The aim of this rolling Audit is to monitor prescribing trends and compliance with NICE guidance. The GH Audit is now part of the BSPED Peer Review process. At Peer Review individual centre prescribing practices will be reviewed in comparison with national practices. You may choose to compare your current practice against UK data by downloading GH Reports through the [online members' area](#).

Testosterone Replacement Guidelines

The Clinical Committee has reviewed and approved the recently updated guideline on [Testosterone Therapy in Infancy and Adolescence](#) which is now available via the BSPED website.

Peer Review

The Clinical Committee is currently developing guidance documents and self-assessment questionnaires to assist Peer Review leads with the process.

London South Bank University – Nurse Endocrine Module

London South Bank University is pleased to run the 20 credit nurse endocrine module 'Principles of care for the child and young person in Endocrinology' in the next academic year, at level 6 and level 7. The dates are:

- Thursday 23 and Friday 24 January
- Thursday 20 and Friday 21 February
- Thursday 19 and Friday 20 March

Days in the University are comprised of lectures and group work, starting at 0900 and finishing at 1700. The assessment consists of a case study presentation, focusing on how innovative nursing practice and interventions can enhance the patient experience, and competencies to achieve in clinical practice. The nurse giving the most outstanding presentation will be invited to give their presentation in the nurses' session at BSPED later that year. The assessment / hand in date is Friday 1 May 2020.

It has been confirmed that the BSPED will generously financially support up to 9 nurse members to undertake the module. The nurse must be a BSPED member, and priority will be given to nurse specialists working in paediatric endocrinology. The places will be given on a first come, first served basis, and decided by the University.


Stakeholder registration is open for all stakeholders, including patients, carers, service users, members of the public, clinical staff, provider organisations working in specialised services and voluntary sector partners.

It is the registered stakeholders who are automatically sent new specifications and policies for comment.

You can sign up for one or more Clinical Reference Groups (CRGs). You would at least need to sign up for paediatric medicine and specialised surgery in children to receive the testing for the DSD specification and policy when this is carried out.
